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Ensures every task follows the protocol, GCP and regulatory guidelines

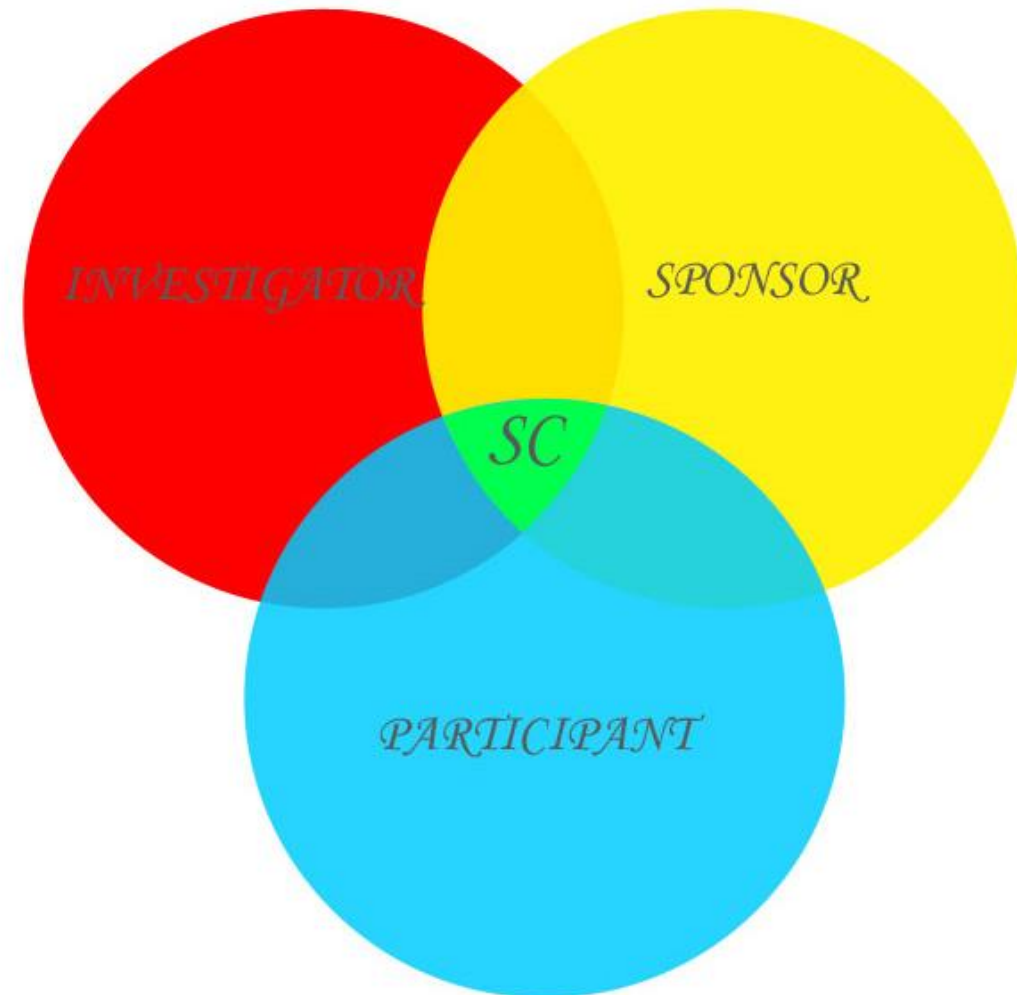


## How do SCs serve as strategic partners in clinical research?

# Traditional Role of Study Coordinators



Data collection and owns the CRFs and source data like a guardian of accuracy



Visit scheduling, tracks data and makes sure every box is ticked



Historically viewed as support staff



# Evolving Role in Modern Clinical Research

- Clinical trials are increasingly complex and data-driven.
- Main contact for CRAs and sponsor reps – the site's voice.
- Focus on data quality, compliance, and patient safety.
- Coordinates visits, answers queries and cleans discrepancies fast.
- Keeps eCRFs and file spotless – always inspection ready.



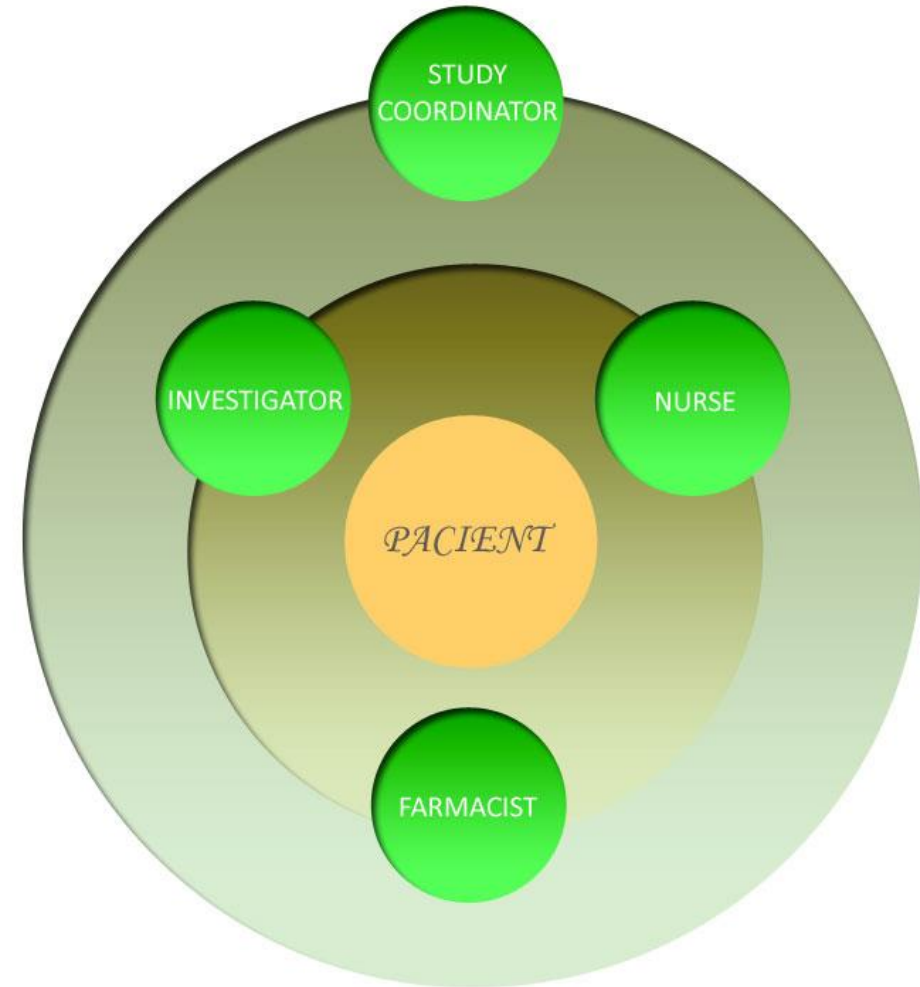
# Strategic Contributions

- Operational efficiency: Process optimization and protocol adherence.
- Quality assurance: Early identification of data issues.
- Patient engagement: Trust and retention.
- Communication hub across stakeholders.



# Patient Flow

- Example: A coordinator redesigned the patient scheduling workflow.
- Outcome: 20% faster visit, 30% fewer missed visits.
- Result: Improved trial performance and sponsor satisfaction.

- Training new staff and ensuring SOP compliance



- Providing feedback during protocol design



- Managing audits and regulatory visits
